8. When the rākṣasa comes, all the women (नारी, see 7.1) say "hā hā."
9. Rāma saw the demon on account of whom Sītā was distressed.
10. Since the sage is a protector of demons, what is the alternative?
11. A twice-born who is skilled (clever) in archery will not experience worry.
12. Who is that woman who goes quickly to the hermitage?
