

Translate the following sentences into Sanskrit (number in brackets indicates गण (gaṇa) to which root belongs).

1. Where is the demon? (use वृत्—√vṛt 1Ā); I think he is in the ashram (āśramah) (use स्था—√sthā 1P).
2. How does the hero cut off the limbs of the demon? I know! He does it with the arrow.
3. How do you know? Since the lady says it, therefore I know it.
4. Whenever Rāma comes, the demons are afraid (use भी—√bhi 3P), but Rāma is never afraid.
5. Lady! In this region there is another forest.
6. Then the sages of the hermitage obtained permission from the goddess (देवी—devī).
7. The rākṣasas sit (सद्—√sad 1P) on the ground and perform (कु—√kr 8P) meditation.
8. When Rāma picks up an arrow, the demons all flee.
9. The descendants of Raghu assembled for the protection of the city of Mithilā.
10. The women of that region do not understand the bliss of marriage.
11. Hail, daughter! Where does the sage go?
12. He went to Mithilā; and now, a rākṣasa is harassing me here in the forest.
