

C. Translate the following sentences into Sanskrit:

1. When Rāma came for Sītā's स्वयंवर (svayamvara), all the kings ridiculed him.
2. None of the kings (lit., no king at all) lifted Śiva's bow.
3. The sages did not understand what you said. (Put relative clause first.)
4. Janaka stood up in the assembly (सभा—sabhā) of the kings and said, "Rāma has won." (Use इति [iti]).
5. Finally the proud king became very angry (ऋध्—√krudh).
6. But the hero did not exert himself and did not break the bow.
7. The proud queen forgot the name of the angry sage.
8. "O, Śambhu! You promised me a kingdom!" he said.
9. That woman never forgot her स्वयंवर (svayamvara).
10. The king's son, by name Devadatta, reviled Śambhu.
11. A fool does not easily obtain the Self.
12. "Why did he eat grass?" they thought.
